



# CLEVE HERITAGE WALK



**SELF-GUIDED TOUR, REFER TO MAP.**

- 1. Centenary Park** - on display are implements from the horse and bullock era, as well as old machinery.  
*Go east on south side of Main Street.*
- 2. Old Tribune building** - Eyre Peninsula Tribune Newspaper has been capturing Cleve district's stories for over 100 years.  
*Go east on south side of Main Street.*
- 3. Pharmacy** - Originally set up by Louis Stubing as a fruiterer and cool drink vendor in 1912.  
The store has since changed many times, from Jenny Cook's Fashion and Fabrics to Hiern's Furniture and Flooring.  
*Go east on south side of Main Street.*
- 4. ANZ Bank** - Since 1910 the ANZ building has been used as a bank and a house for the manager.  
*Go east on south side of Main Street.*
- 5. Newsagency** - Historically known as "Smallacombe's Corner", it has always been the newsagency.  
*Turn right onto west side of Fourth Street.*

- 6. Mitre 10** - The social need for a gathering place saw the first institute built in 1894.  
*Go south on west side of Fourth Street.*
- 7. Christian Bookshop/Op Shop** - From groceries, to electrical, to op shop. Everything for everyone!  
*Go east on south side of Main Street.*
- 8. Motel** - In 1911, Cleve had a 'Skating Rink'. This stood for many years until dismantled in 1949.
- 9. Hotel** - Originally built in 1910, the Cleve Hotel Motel has been the only pub in town.  
*Cross over to east side of Fourth Street and go south.*
- 10. Anglican Church** - The first stone was laid on 22 May 1913. The St. Michael and All Angels Anglican Church stands today as a beautiful architectural feature.
- 11. Giersch's House** - A house of many occupants.
- 12. Paul Humphrys** - First house and Post Office of Cleve.  
*Turn right at Main Street and go east, cross over at East Terrace past Police Station.*

- 13. Police Station** - upholding the law since 1912.  
*Go north on East Terrace.*
- 14. Cleve Area School** - Formal education in the Cleve district since 1886.  
*Go west on Second Street.*
- 15. Uniting Church 1885** - First building, first church and first school.  
*Continue south on east side of Third Street.*
- 16. National Trust Museum** - First District Council of Cleve Chambers, now a National Trust Museum.  
*Continue down east side of Third Street.*
- 17. District Council of Cleve Chambers** - Opened on 17 December 1999.  
*The sign for the chambers on Main Street is in front of building. Cross the road and go west on the north side of Main Street.*
- 18. Cleve Boutique Accommodation** - From harness and ironmongery beginnings to boutique accommodation.  
*Continue west on Main Street, past Birdseye Bus Stop and hall. Turn right and go north on east side of Fourth Street. Or, skip to 21 then back track to 19 and 20. (Refer to map).*

- 19. A Bank/teacher housing/private residence.**  
*Keep heading on the east side of Fourth Street, skipping one property.*
- 20. First Methodist Manse** - This home was used as a Manse until 1966. When upkeep expenses became exorbitant, it was decided to build a new Manse next door.  
*Head back down the east side of Fourth Street. When you reach the hall, cross the road until you reach the post office on the north side of Main Street.*
- 21. Post Office**  
*Keep heading down main street, then turn right onto Fifth Street. Walk down the east side of Fifth Street until you reach the last house. Or, if you went to 21 then back tracked to 19 and 20, continue to head down Fourth Street, and turn down North Terrace to Fifth Street.*
- 22. Early house of Cleve** - Originally owned by Louis Stubing, the original rooms are more than 100 years old.  
*\*Wittwer Park - call into the park on the way past: The Fauna park was opened in 1968-1989 and was an important tourist attraction for the Cleve community.  
Cross to west side of Fifth Street, continue until you reach the corner of Second and Fifth Streets.*

- 23. First Lutheran Manse/family home 1911**  
*Continue down Fifth Street.*
- 24. Doctor/drycleaner** - In the 1930s a dry cleaning business began. It was forced to close in the early 1940s due to wartime shortage of white spirits.  
*Keep heading down Fifth Street until you reach Landmark, then turn right onto Main Street.*
- 25. Landmark** - Blacksmith to central store, to agriculture suppliers.  
*Continue right, down the north side of Main Street.*

- 26. Originally a boarding house for travelling businessmen and nursing home**  
*Continue down Main Street until you reach the Cleve Showgrounds.*
- 27. Cleve Showgrounds and A.H&F Society** - In 1909, a portion of the parklands surrounding Cleve was dedicated as a reserve for show purposes. The Cleve Show is still held annually on the same site.
