CLEVE MOTOR TRADE ASSOCIATION (MTA) RECEIVES STATE FUNDING TO EXPAND



In the heart of Cleve, at 33 Fourth Street, lies an essential hub for the future of our district—the Motor Trade Association of South Australia's (MTA) Cleve Skills Centre. Since opening in Cleve in 2019, MTA Cleve has played a pivotal role in nurturing talent and expertise in the automotive retail, service, and repair industry. Now, exciting news is on the horizon as MTA Cleve is set to receive a \$400,000 grant from the State Government as part of the Skills Centre Pilot Program, which was created to address the pressing need to bridge the skills gap in our state.

The Department for Education South Australia has said "South Australia will need to deliver almost 100,000 vocational education and training (VET) qualifications over the next five years to meet the skills demand of the State's industries."

To address this challenge, the government is supporting the trial of five regional skills centres as part of the Skills Centre Pilot Program, and MTA Cleve is proud to be one of them. With the \$400,000 grant, MTA Cleve will expand its facilities and enhance its capacity to offer apprenticeships, aiming to accommodate up to 150 aspiring professionals. The funding will provide state-of-the-art equipment, a new heavy and agriculture vehicle workshop, and upgrades to classrooms and offices. This development will transform the Cleve Skills Centre into a cutting-edge hub for learning, focusing on agricultural machinery, heavy mechanical, and automotive electrical industries. The Centre will also have a drop-in program set up so people can come in to find out about training and careers in automotive trades. The benefits are substantial, especially for our district. Firstly, it means more opportunities for our local youth. The center will operate as a full-time career hub, encouraging both school-based trainees and school leavers to pursue a fulfilling career in the automotive trade right here in Cleve. By increasing its number of local apprentices from 90 to over 120, MTA Cleve aims to bridge skill shortages and equip our businesses with a talented workforce. This expansion means more than just an improved skills landscape. It means a flourishing local economy; keeping more people in our town while also attracting new young people into our town, as they will have access to quality education and

employment opportunities without needing to head to Adelaide. Thriving local businesses will also directly benefit the local residents.

The MTA Cleve expansion is not just an investment in education; it's an investment in our district's future. It's a testament to the dedication of MTA SA/NT in fostering growth and prosperity in our region. As MTA Cleve takes bold steps towards a brighter automotive industry, it simultaneously paves the way for a stronger, more vibrant Cleve and a promising future for our residents and industry. COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT **KEVIN AND CARMEL BAXTER- 32 YEARS AT THE CLEVE POST OFFICE**

It is the end of an era for Cleve Post Office owneroperators Kevin and Carmel Baxter, who, after 32 years, handed over the keys to new owners Kirsty and Pat Jenner. It was 1976 when Kevin arrived in Cleve, just 19 years old with his green Holden panel van and suitcase. After finding a job at the Cleve Post Office, Kevin never thought he would one day own it, let alone meet the love of his life there, Carmel, while cashing her cheque at the front desk. In 1992, Kevin and Carmel officially took over the Cleve Post Office on the 16th of June on Carmel's birthday. They were the 3rd Australia Post to go private in South Australia. 
